Mobile and sexual harassment in Pakistan



- Serendipitous origins
- 2016 survey; n=530
- Perception of very high levels of sexual harassment through mobiles
 - Both of women (83% frequent or very frequent)
 - And of men (30% frequent or very frequent)
- Differential attribution
 - When a women is harassed, 32% think it is her fault (c.f. 13% with men)
- Very high impact of mobile harassment
 - 41% know someone who has committed suicide as a result
 - 52% know someone who has been killed for honour as a result
- Rich diversity of reasons why mobiles are used
 - Both traditional calls/texts and online



Cultural comparisons



- Ongoing comparative research in
 - Caribbean (n=206) and India (n=154)
 - Sample characteristics are rather different
- Levels of harassment the same or higher
- But impacts seem less than in Pakistan
 - Suicides in India and Caribbean <15%
 - Depression: Pakistan >50%, India and Caribbean < 30%
- Attribution that women are guilty themselves also less <20%
- Differences between experiences and perceptions
 - Perception is that former partners are to blame
 - Reality is that most instances are strangers





Reflections



- Must address the dark side
 - And how to mitigate these impacts
- Scale of sexual harassment through calls, texts and online is much higher everywhere than most people think
- It is culturally differentiated, and very complex
 - But clear patterns are emerging
 - Mobiles exaggerating existing trends
- Need multiple policy and practice action
 - But respondents see social media companies as having a key role



The Flawed Solution

when the engineer goes too wild...

First flawed approach





In addition a SMS based service which offers the same functionality.





Problems

- Abuse add a number of someone who was not actually involved in harassment – as a form of harassment itself.
- Harassers are often already known by the victim or often come from their own social environment.
- Legal implications crowdsourcing numbers of potential harassers; Getting sued by people in the database.
- Data Management who maintains the database?
 Manually add/delete entries or handle user communication.

Brainstorming Method

Brainstorming/-writing

- Social Process
- Involves coming up in many, often radical ideas
- Solution orientated
- There are constraints
- Goal: find as many ideas as possible

Programmed thinking VS lateral thinking





Brainstorming/-writing: Rules (1)

- Quantity before Quality the more ideas the better!
- Crazy ideas are wanted!
 - Break the old pattern, find the new path
- Listen to others
 - Every ideas counts, every voice is equal
 - There is no place for personal beliefs





Brainstorming/-writing: Rules (2)

Criticism is forbitten!

- Any criticism destroys the flow, it's a dialog not a discussion!
- Discussion will happen afterwards
- Find a good surrounding
 - Be relaxed, feel comfy and make others feel the same

Combine Ideas

- Share, change and combine ideas
- There is no idea "Copyright"
- Note down all the ideas





Brainwriting: Brainwriting-Pool

Procedure

- Ideas are written down individually by the participants on cards
- Cards are passed on to neighbors (neighbor can pass)
- Neighbors read the idea and can comment/improve the idea
- After one round, they are collected in the brainwriting pool
- Ideas can be taken from the pool for new points of contact
- Final Assessment Phase: Group / summarize found ideas
